**They Sailed the Ships – Thames Naval Control 1939-45**

With the paying off of HMS Leigh on October 15<sup>th</sup> 1945 over 6 years of wartime association of the Navy with Southend, apart from the closing chapter of HMS Westcliff, now taking place, came to its official end, and there remains but the task of restoring to their rightful owners the premises for so long occupied by the Thames Naval Control in Royal Terrace, Cliff Town Parade and other places in the vicinity. For six long years the good people of Southend and Westcliff, to say nothing of the many visitors to the town, have become accustomed to the comings and goings of the Navy and the W.R.N.S., who have worked among them and have kept anxious vigil over the gateway of the busiest estuary in the world in the dark and hazardous days, as well as in the hour of triumph. Today, “like snow upon the desert dusty face” they have lighted their little hour and are gone. How long we wonder, will they and their works be remembered?
